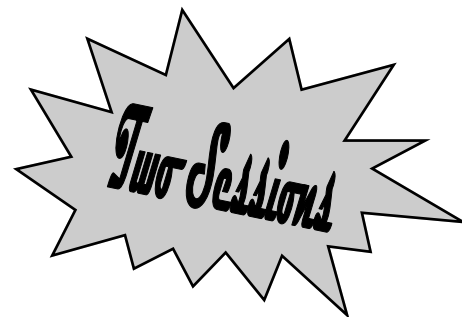

ECSD High School Summer Credit Recovery Program 2021



- What:** Summer School Program for current 9th - 12th graders
Courses are designed to make-up credits after failing a comparable class during the school year. **Courses are taken via Edgenuity E2020, which is a web-based interactive program and students will receive instruction through on-line demonstrations, lectures and assignments.** Parents will receive a final report on student progress. Credit will be awarded upon successful completion of the course. Additional hours of work/study outside of the school day will be needed each session to complete the course(s). **All courses must be completed by the end of the session. Incomplete courses will not be carried forward into the 2021-2022 school year.**
- When:** Monday, June 21- Monday, July 19, 2021 (Session #1)
Monday, July 26 - Friday, August 20, 2021 (Session #2)

- Where:** St. Clair High School (Session #1)

- Tuition:** All classes are free to students currently enrolled in the East China School District.
- Registration** **You can register by clicking on the following link [High School Summer Program 2021](#) or you can go to our website (ECSD.us) and click on the Summer Program tab. Registrations must be completed prior to Friday, June 11.** Final details are pending subject to enrollment numbers so remember to register early!
- Credit:** The Summer Program is open to students currently in grades 9-12 and who have failed one or more classes. This is a credit recovery program. Each one semester course counts as a half credit (.5); a maximum of one (1) credit may be earned per session. But only one class at a time can be taken. It is the student's responsibility to contact his/her counselor to get approval for the course needed. Students are expected to attend daily and to complete final exam prior to the end of the session. Upon counselor approval, students may be allowed to complete course work virtually. This is on a case-by-case basis. **The final exam must be completed in person, no exceptions.** All course work, including the final exam, must be completed by July 19 for Session #1 and August 20 for Session #2 in order to receive credit.
- Attendance:** Students must arrive on-time and attend all classes. Only three (3) absences are allowed in the program. Tardies will count toward the total number of allowable absences (two tardies = one hour of absence, three hours of absence = one session absence). Students will be removed from the program if the attendance policy is violated.
- Student Safety:** Student safety is of paramount importance. Students who enter or leave the building after classes have started for the day must check in or out with a summer program teacher. Not doing so may be grounds for dismissal from the program. The district return to learn plan for 2020-2021 school year will still be adhered to for the summer school program. All students will be required to wear a mask while in the building.
- Materials:** Each student is responsible for materials assigned to him/her while taking a course. This includes such items as computers and all related peripherals. If any property is damaged or lost, the student is responsible for payment.
- Code of Conduct:** Rowdiness, foul language, smoking, substance abuse, inappropriate use of an automobile, or vandalism may result in suspension and/or removal from the program. Any inappropriate behavior will be handled as per the East China Code of Conduct and may result in a student's immediate dismissal from the Summer Learning Program. Please read the Code of Conduct carefully. *If it is necessary to send a student home because of inappropriate behavior, dress, or other Code of Conduct violation, the student will be issued absences for missed class time and will not be allowed additional time to complete the coursework.*
- Driving Behavior:** Driving to summer school is a privilege. Students may park only in the designated parking lot. Inappropriate use of a car on, or in proximity of, school grounds may result in removal from the program and/or notification of police. Inappropriate use may include, but not be limited to, speeding, drag racing, damaging property, inappropriate parking, etc.
- Drop off - Pick up times:** High school students enter by main entrance of the high school. Students should arrive or leave within five minutes of the starting and ending times of school. Adult supervision is not provided before or after this five-minute time period.
